

Current Waiting Times & Patient Population for Gender Identity Clinics in the UK

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Contains Information for May to July 2015

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Foreword

UK Trans Info is a national organisation focused on improving the lives of trans and non-binary people in the UK. One of our main aims is to promote transparency, clarity and openness within public sector organisations. As such we have sent a series of requests under the Freedom of Information Act to all NHS and HSCNI organisations which contain an adult Gender Identity Clinic (GIC). The purpose of these requests was to find out more about the waiting lists for accessing gender identity services in the UK and also to find out more about the current patient population.

These requests are currently being sent on a quarterly basis. This report covers a three month period from May to July 2015. This is the first report in which we have been able to cover GICs in Scotland and Northern Ireland as well as England. Wales does not currently have its own GIC.

Gender Identity Clinics Included in this Report

England

There are seven adult GICs in England. They are all commissioned by NHS England and accept referrals from any patients who is registered with a GP in England.

- Charing Cross in London run by West London Mental Health NHS Trust
- Leeds GIC run by Leeds and York Partnership NHS Foundation Trust
- Northamptonshire Gender Dysphoria Service in Daventry run by Northamptonshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust
- Northern Region Gender Dysphoria Service in Newcastle run by Northumberland, Tyne and Wear NHS Foundation Trust
- Nottingham Centre for Gender Dysphoria run by Nottinghamshire Healthcare NHS Foundation Trust
- Porterbrook Clinic in Sheffield run by Sheffield Health and Social Care NHS Foundation Trust
- West of England Specialist GIC (previously known as The Laurels) in Exeter run by Devon Partnership NHS Trust

Northern Ireland

There is only one adult GIC in Northern Ireland which is the **Brackenburn Clinic in Belfast** run by Belfast Health and Social Care Trust. It accepts referrals from throughout Northern Ireland.

Scotland

There are four adult GICs in Scotland. Most of them only accept referrals from certain parts of Scotland.

- Sandyford Clinic in Glasgow run by NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde accepts referrals from throughout Scotland
- Aberdeen Clinic run by NHS Grampian only accepts referrals from patients in the NHS Grampian area
- Inverness Clinic run by NHS Highland only accepts patients from the NHS Highland area
- Chalmers Clinic in Edinburgh run by NHS Lothian only accepts patients from the NHS Lothian and NHS Borders areas

Wales

Wales does not currently have it's own GIC. All adult patients in Wales are referred to **Charing Cross in London**. They are not able to choose an alternative GIC.

First Appointments at GIC

We asked how many patients had their first appointment with the GIC in the three months. This does not include any patient that by passed part of the waiting list.

For the English GICs, this is a significant increase in first appointments since last quarter. It is unclear whether this is due to the new financial year starting in April or whether this is the beginning of a sustained increase. There is no historical data available yet for Scotland or Northern Ireland.

Waiting Times for First Appointments at GIC

We also asked how long on average those patients who had a first appointment betweek May and July had been waiting for their appointment since they were referred. While this tells us the waiting time for those currently reaching the end of waiting list, it is not necessarily an accurate prediction for those who are just joining the list.

IMPORTANT NOTE: These waiting times refer to those who have just reached the end of the list. This is not necessarily an indication of how long you will have to wait if you have been referred.

In order to get a better idea of what patients currently being referred to clinics should expect, we phoned each of the GICs and asked them how long it would currently take to get an appointment for someone just being referred now.

Current GIC Waiting Lists

We asked how many patients were still on the waiting list for a first appointment as of the end of July 2015.

For the English GICs, this means that all waiting lists have substantially increased since the last quarter, despite the increase in first appointments. There is no historical data available yet for Scotland or Northern Ireland.

However it is worth noting that there appears to be a certain margin of error in the information the trusts have given us. For example Charing Cross told us they had 1359 patients on the waiting list at the end of April 2015. Between May and July 2015 they told us they had 462 new referrals and that 316 patients had their first appointment. This means the waiting list at the end of July 2015 should have been 1505 patients, but they told us it was 1838 patients. It is unclear where the extra 333 patients have come from, however we have requested clarification.

Patients Who Have Waited Over 18 Weeks

Referral to Treatment (RTT) standards in both England and Scotland state that patients should receive treatment within 18 weeks of referral. There are no relevant standards in Northern Ireland or Wales. We therefore asked each GIC how many of the people on their waiting list had been waiting for over 18 weeks.

As this is the first time we have asked for this information, we cannot yet compare it to historical data.

Current GIC Patient Population

We asked how many patients were currently under the care of each GIC. We defined this to include all patients who have had their first appointment but have not yet been discharged from the clinic.

If we combine this information with the waiting list information in table 5 then we can see how many people are engaging with gender identity services at any stage from referral to discharge. This will not include anybody who has been referred to a local mental health assessment service prior to referral.
